Harmful insects in the home

Keep in mind that moving brings its share of inconveniences. If you see small harmful insects (bed bugs, cockroaches, or others), do not hesitate to take the necessary measures to stop them and prevent their spread. You can call on the services of exterminators, they are specialized in this field.

My garbage or recycling bin is broken, what should I do?

The garbage or recycling bin, like any consumer good, has a limited lifespan of approximately 10 years. Exposed to bad weather and the sun, the bin wears out and eventually cracks. If the bin is damaged, it is the citizen's responsibility to replace the bin. The supplier will not pick up your bin if it's too damaged.

What if my bin has not been emptied?

Check that you have taken out your bin before 5 a.m. on the day of the pick up in your sector, and that it was placed on the edge of the street, wheels facing the ground, clearance of one meter around bin. Make sure your bin contained only accepted materials. Otherwise, call us at 450-829-2625
